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Karl Gustafson called the meeting to order @ 1:09 PM.

### **Adopt Meeting Agenda:**

\*\*Brian T. made a motion to adopt the agenda, Joe M. seconded, and the motion passed unanimously\*\*

#### **Old Business:**

- Montgomery County
  - o Reviewed John Mazzarella's presentation
  - Stone Lodge, Palatine Bridge
    - To acquire for the amount of \$34,500.00
    - To stabilize and sell with scope
  - \*\*Brian T. made a motion to acquire the Stone Lodge from Montgomery County for \$34,500.00, Meg K. seconded, and the motion passed unanimously\*\*
    - Discussion:
      - o Potential to sub-divide 12 acres of land that accompanies the structure
        - There is an alternate rear entrance to the property
  - Conveyance properties from Montgomery County
    - It is recommended that the board entertain and accept the conveyance properties from the County for \$3,500.00 plus fees.
    - These properties include:
      - 224 W. Main St., Fort Plain
      - 219 Canal St., Fort Plain
      - 3 W. Main St., St. Johnsville
      - 13 Lower Prospect St., Fonda
      - 63 Center St., Fort Plain
      - 21 Lydius St., Fort Plain
      - 39 Monroe St., St. Johnsville
  - \*\*Brian T. made a motion to accept these properties from Montgomery County, Meg K. seconded, and the motion passed unanimously\*\*
  - \$30K cap to purchase additional properties of interest at the auction

\*\*Brian T. made a motion to authorize Tolga to spend up to \$30K on properties of interest at the Montgomery County Tax Foreclosure Auction, Joe M. seconded, and the motion passed unanimously\*\*

- Discussion:
  - o It was asked if the land bank was taking on too much work that would not be completed in a reasonable amount of time.
    - The land bank needs a project pipeline to show work and progress to grantors
      - Need shovel-ready projects for the CRI III grant
        - o Application due September 7<sup>th</sup>
    - The county cannot dictate timeline of work for properties purchased from the auction
      - This only applies to properties transferred prior to the auction
    - It is the goal of the land bank and Project Selection Committee to have projects completed within a year.
      - It was then asked if we would have an adequate number of contractors to help us meet our goals with the growing number of properties in our inventory
        - It was noted that this could pose a potential problem, but the goal is to have contractors vetted and lined-up in the near future so we have a list that we can choose from
